**GHANA CELEBRATES WINNING THE FIFA U-20 WORLD CUP -
PLAYED AT EGYPT INTERNATIONAL STADIUM ON OCTOBER 16, 2009**



Ghana beat Brazil 4 - 3 on penalties in the FIFA Under-20 World Cup final in Cairo International Stadium on October 16, 2009 to become the first African side to win the tournament. The victory in Cairo was only the second U-20 World Cup Final to be decided by a penalty shoot-out.

The **Golden Ball** gong, the second most prestigious honour at the tournament was presented to the overall best player which **Dominic Adiyiah** claimed after beating Alex Teixeira.

Dominic Adiyiah also annexed the **Golden Shoe** award after finishing the competition with 8 goals, three ahead of Vladimir Koman of Hungary. He became the third-top scorer in the tournament's history.

The Black Satellites were runners up in the 1993 and 2001 editions of the tournament after losing to Brazil and Argentina, respectively.
